The symposium will explore the epidemiology, manifestations, and theories of mental distress and mental health disparity for lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer (LGBTQ) populations and subpopulations through a series of seven focused presentations based on substantial research by leading researchers in the field. Upon completion of the symposium, participants will be able to: 1. Describe how homosexuality and gender issues have been historically viewed by mental health organizations; 2. Identify common mental health disparities for members of LGBTQ communities; 3. Explicate the current theory for the development of these disparities; 4. List and explain the main areas of current LGBTQ mental and behavioral health research; 5. Identify research deficits and an agenda for future research necessary to mitigate these deficits.
